

NON-TENURE TRACK ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE/FULL PROFESSOR POSITION IN VETERINARY ANATOMIC PATHOLOGY

The College of Veterinary Medicine, Mississippi State University, invites applications for a non-tenure track assistant/associate/full professor position in Veterinary Anatomic Pathology. The position is associated with the Diagnostic Laboratory Services (DLS) section of the Department of Pathobiology and Population Medicine. Responsibilities include participation in the pathology service and research through the marine animal program, with limited teaching in the professional and residency/graduate program. It is expected that this position will allocate approximately 60% time to diagnostic service, 30% research activities, and 10% time to teaching. The diagnostic service will predominately support the marine animal health program at MSU, which is currently focused on conducting necropsies on marine mammals and sea turtles that strand on the Mississippi coast.

The ideal candidate will have a passion for marine diagnostics and teaching. Minimum qualifications include a DVM or equivalent with ACVP board certification eligibility in anatomic pathology. Collegiality and excellent communication skills are required. Interest or excellence in service is required. The ability to attain licensure (faculty or traditional licensure) in Mississippi is required. The successful candidate will work directly with pathology faculty in DLS. The DLS is a part of the AAVLD fully accredited Mississippi Veterinary Research and Diagnostic Laboratory System, which has diagnostic laboratories located at three sites.
